



Frequently Asked Questions

What essential items do we need to bring to camp?

Are linens provided?

Carolina Creek does not furnish linens for those guests who stay in our cabins. All cabins are twin bunk beds with a bare mattress. Each person in attendance will need to bring their own linens and/or sleeping bag.

However, linens are provided to those guests who rent rooms in the Adult Guest Lodge

What items should we not bring to camp?

Carolina Creek respectfully requests that you not bring any: food (unless it is to be stored in the dining hall), Ipod's, cell phones, or devices of a similar nature.

Camp policy prohibits the bringing of tobacco products, alcohol product, fireworks, or matches from being brought on to the property.

Is food allowed in the cabins?

Carolina Creek policy does not allow for food to be stored or consumed in the cabins or meeting areas. This is essential to keeping insects and other bugs out of the living areas. If you wish to bring food to camp it needs to be stored in the dining hall and 24 hour access is granted to stored food.

Does the Camp have sound equipment?

If your group is unable to provide sound, Carolina Creek is able to provide a speaker and a mic. That may be rented for \$500.

Do our campers need to sign a medical waiver/liability release form?

Yes, every person in attendance must submit a medical waiver upon arrival. The medical release form can be found on the website under the Forms tab or we would be happy to e-mail you a copy.

Does the camp provide a nurse?

Carolina Creek does not have a full time staff nurse. However, all staff is First-Aid and CPR certified and capable of assisting with minor injuries or in emergency situations.

What camp policies should our group be aware of?

- a. Carolina Creek requires all participants to wear closed toed shoes to activities.
- b. Carolina Creek will provide all food needs. If you have special needs or requests please contact us.
- c. Carolina Creek requires Gentlemen to stay in their living spaces and Ladies to stay in theirs.
- d. Carolina Creek recommends that while traveling through camp you do so in groups of at least four.

- e. Carolina Creek does not allow for food or drink of any kind in cabins or meeting areas.

Is there internet access?

Internet access is provided for group leaders in both dining halls and the Adult Guest Lodge. You should see a Carolina Creek Staff member upon arrival about gaining access.
