

Frequently Asked Questions for Summer Camp

1. What if I want to send my camper a letter?

Great! We do mail call every night at dinner. You can bring your camper's mail on drop off day with the day you want him/her to receive it written on the letter, or you can mail it to the camp at:

2. Can I call my camper or can my camper call home?

To discourage homesickness, our policy is that campers will only call home in an emergency. If you need us to get a message to your camper, we will make sure they receive it during mail call.

3. What if my camper gets homesick?

Every Carolina Creek staff is trained to help campers through homesick times. If the camper continues to be homesick, the leadership will visit with him or her and then a call home to visit with parents will be made.

4. What does my camper need to bring to camp?

You can find a "What to Bring" list on our website, www.carolinacreek.org, under the Forms section. You will also be receiving one in the mail.

5. Will my camper participate in every activity?

Campers will rotate through every activity at camp with their cabin group. They will have an opportunity to try everything and then sometimes to go back and play some more at their favorite.

6. How does Carolina Creek Christian Camp handle camper medication?

CCCC supplies a nurse for summer camp. The nurse will be available during drop off and pick up times to receive and return camper medications. The nurse is also in charge of the medication distribution throughout the week.

7. How much money should I send with my camper?

CCCC recommends that you set up an account for \$50 which your camper can spend at the store and/or the snack shack. You can set up their account during your registration or on drop off day.

8. Can I make a roommate request?

Yes, you can make a roommate request on the camper application. Carolina Creek can guarantee at least one roommate request. The campers will be grouped according to age/grade.
